

Holistic Education to Meet the Post 21st Century Challenges

It is with great pleasure that we extend our congratulatory message to the graduating class of 2021. Hongera sana to the graduands and parents/guardians for this mile stone. The Academic and Student Affairs (ASA) Division takes pride in the major strides that the University has continued to make in the field of academia. Our student population continues to grow exponentially. In 2016 when the university was chartered, it had a student population of 7,509, now the population stands at 10,674. In the 2020/2021 Academic Year, the university admitted 2,886 students who are pursuing certificate, diploma, undergraduate and post graduate courses.

We note with excitement that the graduating class of 2016 during our first graduation ceremony stood at 566, this has grown to 1,485 in 2021. This is attributed to the immense dedication of our faculty members and the determination and zeal by the youth to learn and make a difference. In 2019, the University graduated its first PhD student, today we graduate four (4) PhD students. This is a great achievement towards adding value to the emerging knowledge economy.

The university has seen an increase in the number of degree programmes offered from 26 in 2016 to the 35 we are currently offering in 2021. The university remains committed to giving world-class education and training. In 2018 the University established TVET whose student population has grown tremendously from 729 in 2018 to 1,119 in 2021. This is geared towards the provision of qualified human resource for achieving the four big agenda

The University recently established the Centre for Open, Distance and eLearning (ODEL). This is aimed at positioning the University as a premier centre for the dissemination of knowledge to its students at the comfort of their regions and places of work. This has been streamlined by the approval of the ODEL policy by the University Council.

Due to the emerging challenges occasioned by the COVID-19 pandemic, the University has restructured most of the learning activities to embrace blended mode. This is geared towards reducing the number of physical contact hours. In order to adapt to the MOH protocols and guidelines regarding COVID 19, the University embarked on the production of KEBs certified sanitizers, handwash detergents and face masks. We commend the 2021 graduating class for overcoming all these challenges and emerging victorious. The University make great strides

by conducting online admissions and orientations of her 2020/2021 Academic year first year students. Additionally, the review of curriculum and delivery modes is ongoing to enhance adaption to the new normal. Student elections were also conducted electronically with huge success. For continuous provision of guidance to our students, the University established the Office of Career Services. The Office offers mentorship programmes and guidance to students. This has seen our students become more focused and excel in curricula and co-curricular activities.

Towards ensuring that bright but financially disadvantaged students continue their studies at the University without interruption, the University has facilitated the disbursement of bursaries to students. These include bursaries from the Rattansi Educational Trust, Machakos University and Students Association of Machakos University (SAMU). In 2016, the University Chancellor introduced the Chancellors Scholarship Fund to assist the needy and academically

brilliant students. Since its establishment, several students have benefitted from it. We appreciate the Chancellor and all our partners for the continued support and look forward to other initiatives that focus on enhancing student academic progression and talent development.

The Academic Division applauds the graduating class of 2021 for their tremendous achievement. The University is very proud of the graduands and is confident that they will provide solutions to the many challenges facing humanity. We look forward to welcoming you again to continue your academic journey with us as you proceed with your diploma, undergraduate or postgraduate programmes. The Division of Research, Innovation and Linkages was established as part of the University's efforts to harness and utilize its research and innovation talents in a "search for truth". At the centre is entrenchment of a research and innovation culture that embraces academic, moral, intellectual and inspirational orientations.

In the last four years, external research funding for both individual and collaborative projects has continued to grow standing at KES.455 Million, as of March, 2021. We are grateful to the following sources: Organization for Women in Science for the Developing World (OWSD), International Centre for Genetic Engineering and Biotechnology (ICGEB), National Disaster Management Authority, Norwegian Partnership Programme for Global Academic Cooperation

disseminated findings through 153 papers in peer refereed journals, and continue to participate and present papers in international conferences.

As we celebrate our 5th Graduation Ceremony, we also celebrate the support we continue to receive from our strategic partners as we pursue our mandate. I wish to mention Tianjin City Vocational College with whom we have together successfully established the Luban Workshop. The Workshop supports ICT degree courses in Cloud Computing and Information Security as well as related ICT skills development and video conferencing. Tribus-TSG is currently supporting the establishment of Ajiry Centre that will provide entrepreneurial infrastructure. Solar Africa is also coming in to support the establishment of Solar Assembly and Manufacturing Plant. We received research equipment that greatly transforms our research capacity.

Alexander Von Humboldt Foundation has given KES 4M to purchase laboratory equipment (Ultra-High Performance Liquid Chromatography -Ultra HPLC), UNESCO is supporting acquisition of Electrochemical Analyzer at a cost of KES2.6M and supporting academic staff at the School of Pure and Applied Sciences to conduct a study at a cost KES 5M, International Centre for Genetic Engineering has supported the University to acquire Automatic Elisa and Washer that is currently supporting research

(NORHED II portfolio 2021-2026), Kenya Medical Research Institute and National Research Fund (NRF). In addition to the growing research funding, members of staff

have cumulatively

in COVID-19 in the University at a cost of KES 550,000, Konza Technopolis. Development Authority continues to support innovation capacity building in the University. Through these partnerships, the University continues to develop infrastructural support to link the academia and industry.


In underscoring the value of staff and student exchange, the University has two Erasmus Programmes with the University of West Attica and Panteion University in Greece. The Programmes are intended to enable academic staff develop new skills, learn and share new ideas and discover best practices through a mobility facility. The University has hosted two Carnegie fellows from Georgetown University and Missouri State University who have been instrumental in capacity building, development of programmes and staff mentorship in their respective departments.

The University continues to promote the sharing of research experiences through conferences. We have successfully held two international conferences that embraced the themes: Harnessing Scientific Research, Innovation and Technology for Sustainable Development and Supporting Green Growth and Knowledge Economy through Research, Innovation and Technology for Sustainable Development, for first and second conference respectively. The two conferences had 500 cumulative participation/audience. Under the theme: Responding to Emerging Global Challenges through Research, Innovation and Technology for Sustainable Development, 3rd International Conference will be held from 22nd -25th June, 2021.

On this auspicious occasion of our 5th Graduation Ceremony, I congratulate our graduands and wish them all the best in their undertakings as they transition into the world of career and work. We remain focused on the University's Mission and purposes to underscore best research practices.


The School admits both Government and Self-Sponsored Students in Diploma, Bachelors, and Postgraduate Programmes




Performance Contracting and Quality Management Systems

It is worth to remind ourselves that the new normal requirements which were triggered by the COVID-19 pandemic in March 2020, at the initial stages disrupted our activities; however, we have learnt to coexist. The Directorate has been able to undertake several activities in endeavour to achieve our mandates, drive the university to realize its vision and that of the country particularly the BIG FOUR Government of Kenya Agenda.

The Directorate is gradually converting COVID-19 pandemic challenges into opportunities for research and innovation activities which are being undertaken by Machakos University staff, students and collaborators. Indeed, during the past 1st, 2nd and 3rd quarters of the 2020/2021 academic year, the directorate of Research innovation and Extension Services reclaimed its role of undertaking capacity building, organizing the 3rd MksU International Conference, 2nd public lecture and 3rd Innovation and Exhibition Week.

The Directorate has been able to undertake four virtual capacity building trainings in key areas of research and innovation. One Grant writing training on “How to Write a Grant-Winning Proposal to Respond to Emerging Global Challenges” was held on 2nd September, 2020. One Intellectual Property (IP) training was conducted on 23rd September 2020. One research, ethics and standards training was held on 11th September 2020 and one training on “Accounting for Research & Innovation Funds; Research Licensing and Institutional Affiliation” was undertaken on 10th February 2021. The trainings were facilitated by our own staff, thereby creating a platform for inculcating the culture of internal mentorship. Using internal facilitators also helped to cut down expenditure that could have been used to invite external facilitators. The facilitators and participants were issued with certificates of attendance.

Six proposals submitted by MksU staff and students have been accepted for funding by external agencies. That is, one collaborative proposal on capacity building by TUK and MksU staff has been accepted for funding. The contact person is Dr. Charles Mwanik. Dr. Veronica Okello won two grants; the 2020 OWSD Early Career (EC) Fellowship programme and a Fellowship program from Carnegie African Diaspora Fellowship Program (CADFP). A collaborative proposal submitted to ECGEB by Dr. Heshborne Tindih was accepted and the project has kicked off. A collaborative proposal submitted to Water ESSENCE Africa meant for Creating synergy to meet the global challenges is funded and is ongoing (Contact Person –Eng. Mwalimu). Dr. Cornelius Okello won a grant from the fellowship program from Global Adaptation Centre and the project is ongoing.

MksU staff and students have published over forty papers in the month of July, 2020 to March 2021 and fourteen members of staff attended external conferences and 160 attended internal trainings. We developed data protection policy, collaboration and partnership policy, and Internal Research and Innovation Funding Policy. It is our hope that the initiatives highlighted will be strides towards improving the university research agenda and to take a more practical approach in strengthening teaching, research and innovations. I wish to congratulate our graduands and I urge you to face the world with courage and learn to convert challenges into opportunities.






